Benefit concert planned for Saturday

Downtown Brevard is typically the center of the spooky season at this time of the year and that will be the case Saturday during the 41st annual Halloweenfest. In addition to the traditional festivities, a free evening benefit concert will feature the Travis Book Band and Steep Canyon Rangers to benefit local businesses impacted by Hurricane Helene.

"Heart of Brevard is thrilled to host Halloweenfest and the

community benefit concert in support of Transylvania Tomorrow. Our amazing community has come together to generously share their talents, showcasing the spirit of unity that defines Transylvania County," said Heart of Brevard Executive Director Nicole Bentley of the event that aims to raise \$500,000 in donations for local businesses in need. "Music is such a vital part of who we are and we believe it has the power to uplift us during these challenging times. Best of all, every dollar raised will

go directly to supporting our small businesses in need, with no administrative fees—100% of the funds go where they're needed most."

Steep Canyon Rangers' Mike Guggino and Mike Ashworth said contributing something special to the annual event seemed like the right thing to do help their hometown in the aftermath of Hurricane Helene.

"Our community has always supported us so much over the years. The Steep Canyon Rangers are honored to be able to do what we can to help with recovery efforts from Helene," the local musicians said in a joint statement. "We want folks to know that Brevard is open for business and one of the best ways we can help is to shop, eat and stay local and to encourage others to visit our town."

The free concert will cap a day full of family-oriented activities downtown that start at 10 a.m. with a street fair featuring more than 50 food and art vendors stationed along Main, Broad, Jordan and Gaston streets.

Judging for the costume contest will begin at 11 a.m. before participants parade their outfits down Main Street.


At 11:45 a.m. members of Carolina Dance Collective will perform and at 12:30 p.m. a witchy flash mob is expected to invade the intersection of Jordan and Broad streets.

Downtown businesses will be open for trick or treating starting at 1 p.m. and the pet parade will begin at Silvermont Mansion and Park at 1:30 p.m. before the procession ends with the pet costume judging on Gaston Street.

A beer garden (with ID and wristbands required) featuring beverages from Oskar Blues Brewing will open at 4 p.m. on East Main Street and the schedule of events ends with a hay bale toss at Silvermont before preparations for the Transylvania Tomorrow benefit gets underway on the Halloweenfest stage located in front of the Transylvania County Visitor Center at 175 E. Main St.

"It's a way to help our children go back out for something that they treasure every year and it is a way for the community to come together in fellowship and strength and support," said Brevard Mayor Maureen Copelof of the special events planned for downtown guests Saturday. "I encourage people to come memorate and remember out and enjoy the day, enjoy the community, but also come out and support our to view these artistic creations businesses because that's where our people work and we can't afford to have any part of our community not recover. Pulling together as a community really is the focus that we're going to have to have going through recovery."
